## About the Program

High-quality and innovative health care relies on strong medical leadership skills. Both clinical and non-clinical leaders must strategically plan for the future, understand financial risks and returns, and promote creativity and professional development to effectively lead their teams to success.

Harvard Medical School's 12-month Leadership in Medicine: Asia Pacific certificate offers a unique opportunity to learn from faculty experts and equip participants to lead and manage complex health care organizations, handle crises, enhance quality and safety, and drive innovation. The program provides two distinct tracks—Clinical Leadership and Faculty Development—enabling students to customize their education to meet their organization's specific needs and choose the path that aligns with their goals.

## Program Format

Our year-long program utilizes an innovative, interactive blended-learning model that combines live instruction with recorded online lectures. Participants will engage in three four-day workshops: the first will take place in person at Sunway University (Malaysia), the second will be conducted live online, and the third will be held in person at Harvard Medical School.

**This hybrid-learning approach includes:**

- 3 intensive workshops
- Interactive webinars
- Self-paced online lectures in between workshops
- Team project
- Individual capstone project

## Who Should Apply

Leadership in Medicine: Asia Pacific is designed for designed for clinicians and health care professionals who are interested in advancing their leadership skills or transitioning to an administrative, management or executive role within a hospital or health system.

- Building skills in teaching, developing curricula, writing assessments, and creating lesson plans

- Developing skills in negotiation, having difficult conversations, and providing feedback
- Fostering creativity throughout a department or an organization
